



## Call for Application

The IHS invites applications for Social Labs Facilitators for the European project “Excellence in Science and Innovation for Europe by Adopting the Concept of Responsible Research and Innovation” (NewHoRRizon, Swafs-09-2016: 741402).

The Social Labs will involve a wide-ranging group of R&I stakeholders who will co-create tailor-made pilot actions to stimulate an increased use and acceptance of Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI) across H2020 and each of its parts. Each Social Lab will involve 15 to 25 participants and will have a lifetime of 32 months (starting in August 2017). There will be a total of three consecutive RRI stakeholder workshops in European capitals.

### The tasks of the Social Lab Facilitators are:

1. to plan and manage the 3 workshops in the Social Lab together with the Social Lab Manager in different EU cities;
2. to participate in a workshop named Creating a Social Lab Manual (location to be agreed);
3. to participate in the two workshops in which the methods of the Social Labs will be reflected and adapted (location to be agreed);
4. to contribute to the monitoring of Social Labs;
5. to contribute to the project blog.

The estimated time exposure for the facilitator is approx. 19.5 days per Social Lab. This includes time for preparation and follow-up as well as the implementation of the 3 workshops of one Social Lab, the participation in the other workshops (see 2 and 3) as well as the contribution in 4 and 5.

If the facilitator moderates 2 or more Social Labs, only 14.5 days are estimated per Social Lab as he/she needs to attend the workshop of point 2 and 4 only once. (e.g. 29 days for facilitation of 2 Social Lab). Although the workshops of the different Social Labs take place in the same time period (but in different EU cities), they are flexible in terms of date.

Travel expenses according to general reimbursement rules of the project will be covered by the IHS.

### Qualifications

The applicant:

- ▶ must have long standing experience in organizing and facilitating small and large group processes, experiential learning, and co-creative group processes;
- ▶ must be acquainted with innovative methods in this area that promote outcome oriented and creative thinking (art of hosting, dialogical methods, etc.);
- ▶ must be acquainted with R&I processes;
- ▶ must have a profound knowledge of and first-hand experience with processes of research and technological innovation.

Experiences in the evaluation, monitoring and assessment of RTD Programmes at the European level are highly welcome as well as a strong background in natural sciences and/or social science.
