His research focuses mainly on inequality and effectiveness of education systems (early tracking, elite schools, vocational education and training) and the effect of non-cognitive skills on educational success (measurement of time-, risk-, social and competitive preferences), as well as measurement issues in education. He has been teaching quantitative methods on undergraduate and graduate level for over a decade (introduction to empirical analysis and causal methods and program evaluation). He is regularly attending international scientific conferences, and also frequently gives expert opinion in Hungarian media outlets on education.
